Deadline Extended: March 26

The Texas Society of Architects (TxA) Design Awards program recognizes outstanding built architectural and urban design projects by architects practicing in Texas to promote public interest in design excellence.

Entries should demonstrate the following design features: the positive impact on individuals and communities that use the project; effectiveness in accomplishing the goals of clients and users; sustainability and energy efficiency; and appropriateness of visual character. The Design Award program seeks to recognize a broad range of project types, addressing a full spectrum of architectural innovations and urban solutions. The scope of projects we encourage encompasses new construction, adaptive reuse, restoration, the renovation of historically significant buildings, and completed urban design projects. To align with AIA National's Framework for Design Excellence, each entry is required to complete the Common App document to describe how the project addresses the principles, including sustainability, resilience, and inclusiveness.

The Design Awards jury will convene in April. Once the final selections have been made, winners will be notified and then announced on the TxA website and social media.

Award-winning projects will be published in the 2026 Awards issue of *Texas Architect*.

Entry Checklist

Entries must be submitted online via *Submittable form*. Each entry must contain the following:

- PDF Presentation (18 slides max)
- JPEG copy of each slide (18 slides max)
- Project Description (300 words max, to be included on the second slide)
- Common App* for Design Excellence
- 2-3 high-resolution images (maximum file size: 3 MB each)
- Completed submission form via *Submittable*, with permission from all appropriate parties
- Entry fee payment (non-refundable):
 - » \$250 per entry for TxA and NOMA members
 - » \$395 per entry for non-members

PROJECT ELIGIBILITY

To be considered for a Texas Society of Architects 2026 Design Award, projects must be submitted in accordance with the following requirements:

- » For all architectural projects, construction must have been completed after January 1, 2021.
- » Temporary installations and built studio projects designed by emerging professionals, students, and faculty must have been completed after January 1, 2021.
- » Entries must be submitted by the design architect, who must have been registered with the Texas Board of Architectural Examiners (TBAE) at the time the project was executed. For projects executed in collaboration with other firms, the Entry Form must be signed off on by all contributing firms, with a description of their respective roles. This is done in order to verify proper attribution.
- » Individuals or firms whose primary offices are in Texas may enter any number of projects located anywhere in the world. Texas-registered architects based in another state may enter any number of projects located within Texas.
- » Projects must be submitted in the name of the firm that executed the commission. If that firm has been dissolved, or if its name has been changed, an individual or successor firm may enter projects under the name of the firm in effect at the time the project was executed.
- » Multiple entries for the same project by successor individuals or firms will not be accepted. For multi-building projects, the architect submitting the project or portion thereof must designate authorship of each portion of the project.
- » Special attention should be placed on listing all collaborating firms. All submissions will be reviewed to check for possible omissions.

PRESENTATION CRITERIA

- » PDF presentations must contain no more than 18 pages/slides per project; however, each slide may contain more than one image.
- » Floor plans and a site plan or an aerial photo are required.
- » Include graphic scales, directional north arrows, and indications of context and preexisting conditions to ensure a complete understanding of the project. Provide both interior and exterior images of the project.
- » The first slide must include one photo of the project, the project title along with its total square footage and location.
- » A 300-word description (to be included on the second slide) of the project should include evidence of its positive impact on individuals and communities, as well as of the extent to which it achieves client/user goals.
- » **NEW IN 2026:** The final slide must include any 2-3 narratives from the project's Common App form, highlighting the most important measures for the project. This slide may also include the spidergraph generated at the top of the form (spidergraph is optional).
- » Submissions must include a completed Common App document demonstrating environmental performance strategies (see Submission Requirements on page 2). Submissions do not need to address all aspects of the Framework for Design Excellence, they should showcase performance data and relevant information in this context.
- » The name of the entrant and/or entrant's firm must NOT be visible on any of the images, slides, or CommonApp; if this happens, the entry risks disqualification.

Special Criteria

- » **URBAN DESIGN**
Urban design projects may involve landscape architecture, planning programs, civic improvements, environmental considerations, and redevelopment fixes. Urban design projects must be built to be eligible.
- » **INTERIOR ARCHITECTURE**
Include a photo of the building's exterior, along with floor plans and interior photography.
- » **RESTORATION/REHABILITATION/RENOVATION**
Projects can range in scope from restoration to the renovation of historically significant buildings. Indicate pre-existing conditions via plans and/or photos.

Presentation Tips

- » Order your images so that they tell a clear, concise story.
- » Use plans and photos to support the story. Show simplified, clean plans for quick comprehension. Plans should support and complement the photos.
- » Select only the best photos to represent your project. You may not need all 18 pages/slides to illustrate the design solution.
- » The jurors will view submissions on computer and TV screens. Keep the slides oriented horizontally.
- » Edit your presentation for screen display. Size text, plans, and images accordingly. No animations or videos.
- » Show images as large as possible on each slide. You may group multiple images on one slide.
- » Brief captions or labels help jurors quickly grasp important information.
- » Adhere to the digital requirements, making sure your presentation is in PDF format and no larger than 20 MB.

SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Please read carefully. Below are necessary for preparing your submission. An entry risks disqualification if requirements are not followed. Please submitted online: texasarchitects.org/design-awards.

PDF Presentation

- » Provide one presentation in PDF format with no more than 18 pages/slides. The file name should be the same as the project name (for example, "JonesHouse.pdf").
- » The **first/title slide** must include:
 - a. one photo of the project
 - b. the project title
 - c. project total square footage
 - d. project location
- » The **second slide** of the presentation must include the project description with bullet points and/or a brief paragraph about the project, on a white back background. The narrative must describe the project in 300 words or less. Include program requirements, design solutions, and information supporting objectives such as sustainability, energy-efficient performance, etc. This slide should include the project name; it may also include an image.
- » NEW IN 2026 – The **final slide** must include:
 - a. Two to three narratives (from any measures) from the project's Common App form, highlighting the most important measures for the project
 - b. Do not include stand-alone metrics
 - c. May include the spidergraph generated from the top of the form (spidergraph is optional)
- » **Do not** identify the entrant or firm on the slides, images, or in any text.
- » All presentation pages are **required** to be 11 x 8.5 inches, and oriented horizontally (landscape).
- » Ensure font sizes are 7.5 pt or larger. Text size must be readable on each page when printed.
- » Presentations should be concise and of high graphic quality. They may not contain sound, animation, video clips, panorama movies, or hyperlinks.
- » Each PDF presentation file should not exceed 20 MB. **Do not** identify the firm in the file name.

Public Gallery View

- » Provide a JPEG of each slide/page of the presentation. Ensure the final JPEGs of slides are appropriate size for viewing on a screen, saved no larger than 11 x 8.5 inches at 72 or 150 dpi. Each image should be no larger than 2 MB.
- » The file name should be the same as the project name plus page number (for example, "JonesHouse_pg1.jpg"). **Do not** identify the firm in any file names.
- » Upload in the same chronological order as the presentation to Submittable in the appropriate field. These will be used in the public gallery view.

Common App for Design Excellence

- » [Download](#) the Common App, or for more information visit: texasarchitects.org/design-awards.
- » The file is a Microsoft Excel document, and must be completed in Microsoft Excel.
- » Complete, save, and upload the Common App to Submittable form, in the allocated field. Include the project name in the file name. **Do not** identify the firm in the file name.
- » Fill in the information to your best ability. If you completed a Common App for the entry in another awards program, you may reuse the same file if it is the same version provided in the download.

High-Resolution Images

- » Upload 2-3 high-resolution images that best represents the project, and could be published.
- » All images must be in JPEG format, no larger than 3 MB each, and at least 5 inches on the shortest side at 300 dpi.
- » The file name of each image should include both the project name and photographer credit (for example, "JonesHouse_photobyJohnSmith"). **Do not** include your firm name in the file name.
- » Note: By providing these images, the entrant is providing permission for the Texas Society of Architects to use photographs for editorial and promotional purposes.

Completed Entry Form

- » Each entry must include a fully completed [Submission Form](#) approved by all appropriate parties, the Common App, and payment.

Entry Fee Payment

- » Entry fee is \$250 per entry for TxA and NOMA members, and \$395 per entry for non-members. Pay online using a debit or credit card.
